As individuals/organisations, we are each working and engaging in projects and initiatives for health across Africa including advocacy here in the UK and beyond.

Whilst we remain supportive of these encouraging individual efforts, we believe that further benefits can be gained from a collective and strategic approach that would maximise our combined skills and resources to a greater scale that will impact on the whole of Africa.

To achieve this we have agreed to work together under a collective platform that would consolidate our common diaspora health voices - to advocate, engage and mobilise at strategic levels in the UK, Africa and globally.
